



# TSFX Maximising ATAR Scores HSC Summer School

"Summer School" lectures are to be held at the University of Sydney in January 2014.

The program offers students the opportunity to obtain a **significant head start** into the 2014 HSC syllabus. Each lecture will thoroughly review and then extend on the materials covered in Term 4 of 2013 as well as provide students with a comprehensive coverage of Term 1 - 2014 materials **in advance** of school. Having a solid understanding of course content in advance of covering materials at school will enable students to absorb more information in the classroom, resulting in less time being spent on homework, improved confidence and **higher HSC marks**. Students will also receive **comprehensive notes** that include all of the relevant theory, full worked examples, take home questions, as well as advance exposure to exam style questions and analytical/problem solving strategies so as to maximise mid-year examination scores.

Students who have attend "Summer School" in past years have strengthened understanding of course materials, decreased workloads and stress levels at school, increased confidence and motivation and greatly improved performance in tests, assignments and exams.
