## Importance Notice to Parents/Carers

Dear Parents/Carers,

I am writing to advise you about the nature of some random chat websites that have the potential to put young people at risk of serious harm. There are a number of these sites available—  
e.g. omegle.com.au and chatroulette.com

Essentially, these sites allow users to talk to strangers. Once logged on, the site randomly connects users to other users anonymously. Chats can be via text messages or video. The facility even has what it calls a 'spy mode' so people can see other's chats without their knowledge. These sites allow for easy access to popular social media portals like Facebook and Twitter, which create risks for others as well. NSW Police have issued a strong warning to all parents and carers about these sites, particularly Omegle.

The Internet is a powerful learning tool for students when used effectively, and can also be a source of entertainment and social interaction. However, regular and careful monitoring of your child's use of the internet is critical to ensure that he/she can continue to use this valuable resource safely.

I particularly encourage you to be vigilant about this site, and if you have any concerns, report them to your Local Area Command or to Crime Stoppers (1800 333 000). An excellent website to find out more information about this issue is <http://www.cybersmart.gov.au>

# Social Justice at BPC



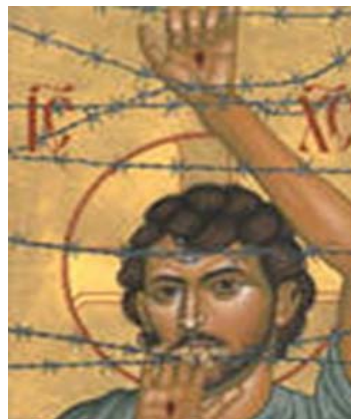
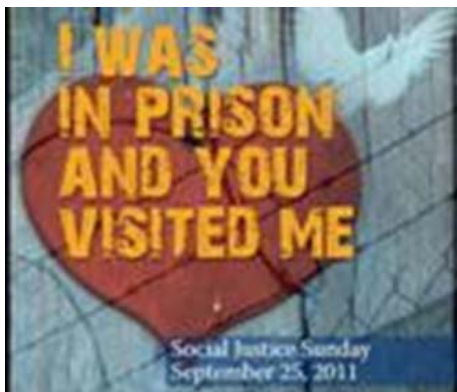
On Wednesday 14 September, a group of students from the College attended the launch of the Australian Catholic Social Justice Council's 2011-2012 Social Justice Statement, 'Building Bridges, not Walls: Prisons and the justice system'. The launch was held at the campus of the Australian Catholic University in North Sydney. The agenda for the morning consisted of the release of the paper by Mr Graham West, Chief Executive Officer of the St Vincent de Paul Society, NSW and a response to the paper by Prison Chaplain for the Diocese of Sydney, Mrs Margaret Wiseman.

The participating students included Liam Culican, Natasha Zammit, Jason Bexterman, Alexander Blume, Brandon Beneke, Elizabeth Peare and Andrew Callus. The students gained a tremendous insight into the work completed by the many Catholic Agencies who work with prisoners and their families across Australia. The students witnessed and were challenged by recounts of personal stories from Prison Chaplain of Silverwater Prison, Mrs Margaret Wiseman.

National Executive Officer of the Australian Catholic Social Justice Council (ACSJC), Mr John Ferguson has requested that I pass on a word of thanks to the participating students from the Chair of the ACSJC, the Most Rev Christopher Saunders, Bishop of Broome.

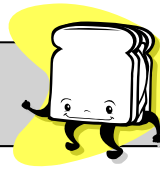

It was clear that people were moved so greatly there were tears. Many felt a close and real presence of God.
