The Library is open from 8.00am—4.00pm Monday-Friday. The Library at Bede College is a vibrant place with a variety of resources for all our students to access.

Come and visit us. The Library staff love seeing new faces.

School holidays are approaching and whether you are travelling, holidaying or just staying at home it's a great opportunity to sit and relax with a good book.

Please come in and see if we have a book that captures your imagination. Perhaps you have younger brothers, sisters or cousins you will be spending time with. Share with them your favourite book. Reading aloud helps develop fluency in reading and everyone loves a story. We are constantly purchasing new books for our students to explore.

Students working their way through the Premier's Reading Challenge have a great opportunity to read and get ahead or to catch up. Remember you only have until the 31st August to read your 20 books and log them in online. You need to read 15 books from the official list and five of your own choice. If you like reading books by the same author or from the same series you can read 2 from the list and 5 of your choice. We have lots of picture books that are Premier's Challenge reads too.

Graphic novels are becoming very popular and we have added more to our growing collection. Fans of Animae and Manga will be sure to find something to wet their appetite. If you have never read a graphic novel try one. You may be surprised. Ask Dad or Mum if they remember reading Tin Tin or Asterix during their school days. These are also a form of graphic novel.

The library staff are great people to talk to if you don't know what to read. Our books in the Fiction area have genre stickers to guide you. If you are a fan of Fantasy books, look for the dragon sticker. A detective story reader looks for the cap and magnifying glass. Ask us about these too. Graphic novels and Premier's Reading Challenge books have special stickers too.

I know that lots of people like to read about unusual and interesting facts. We have the *Guinness Book of Records* and *Ripley's Believe It or Not* books in the Non-Fiction section and a heap of other titles with information about almost anything. If you are working on assignments don't forget that books are a good place to begin your information search.

We hope that everyone will have a restful holiday and find time to curl up with a good read.
